## Channel Restoration along West Highland Creek at Scarborough Golf and Country Club

**Expected End Date: Work Area 1 – April 18, 2019**

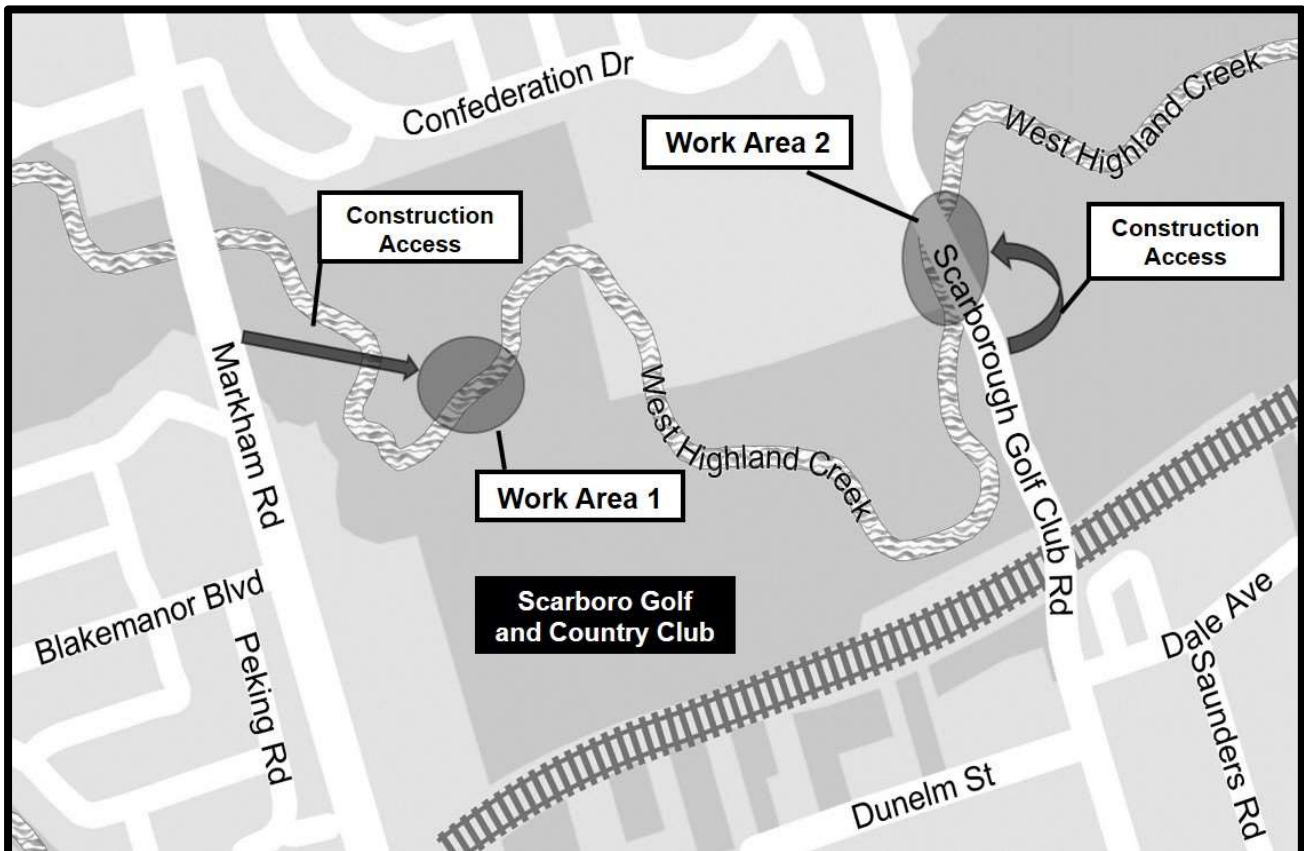
**Work Area 2 – March 31, 2020**

The City of Toronto is planning to install and repair erosion protection measures along West Highland Creek at two locations between Markham Road and Scarborough Golf Course Road (see map).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program that will address existing erosion conditions and improve water quality in West Highland Creek.

## WORK DETAILS


The City's contractor will:

- Access Work Area 1 from Markham Road and Work Area 2 from Scarborough Golf Course Road via the identified access routes on the Scarboro Golf and Country Club property.
- Work within the creek to remove failing infrastructure and construct new erosion protection to improve stability and water quality in West Highland Creek.

## WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews may mark underground utilities near the access routes and work areas, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the proposed work.

	<p><b>Tree Protection:</b> Due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove trees from private property in the ravine. A private property tree removal permit has been obtained in coordination with the City's Parks, Recreation &amp; Forestry Division. Trees removed for the project will be replaced using a replacement ratio of three trees planted for every one tree removed.</p>
	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 am to 5:30 pm, Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Sidewalk Access:</b> Efforts have been made to manage sidewalk use for the safety of pedestrians. Markham Road and Scarborough Golf Course Road sidewalk users may experience minor delays due to construction vehicles entering and exiting the site.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Markham Road and Scarborough Golf Club Road users may experience minor delays due to construction vehicles entering and exiting the site.</p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking near the construction access entrances is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. <b><i>You may use this notice as</i></b></p>

	<p><i>part of your defense for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.</i></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction access areas connecting to Markham Road and Scarborough Golf Club Road will be restored where required. Restoration such as seeding will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only – in the spring (March to April).</p>
