Help Toronto Reduce, Reuse and Recycle: Be part of the 3Rs Working Group!

To help achieve Toronto's goal of diverting 70% of waste from landfill by 2010, City Council established the 3Rs Working Group and is looking for members.

Residents of apartments, condominiums and other multi-family housing are especially needed since one of the greatest challenges is to increase diversion from these types of housing.

The 3Rs Working Group will provide input and advice to the City on various waste diversion initiatives and will participate in the planning and delivery of public education programs relating to reduction, reuse and recycling.

Working Group composition, length of term, honorarium

The Working Group will consist of up to 15 community representatives from the City's four Community Council Areas and from various types of housing. Members will serve for a minimum one-year term and will meet about once a month. A yearly honorarium will be provided.
